The NYU Panhellenic Council (PHC) offers opportunities for leadership, service, scholarship, and personal growth. The average GPA for a Panhellenic woman is 3.52. PHC at NYU is made up of seven National Panhellenic Conference sororities: Alpha Epsilon Phi, Alpha Sigma Tau, Delta Gamma, Delta Phi Epsilon, Kappa Kappa Gamma, Pi Beta Phi, and Zeta Tau Alpha.

With the average chapter size being 148, women are able to form both personal and career connections through alumnae events and from fellow sisters. The women of the Panhellenic Community have gone on to intern at American Red Cross, Columbia Hospital, Columbia Records, Food Network, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, Morgan Stanley, NBC, Ralph Lauren, Saturday Night Live, New York Yankees (to name a few), and went on to attend some of the top graduate schools in the country in pursuit of fields such as law, medicine, education, and business.

The benefits of joining a sorority doesn't stop with networking. Our Panhellenic community thrives on its ability to give back to the community both physically and financially. Throughout the year, each of the chapter spends time fundraising and volunteering for numerous causes and initiatives. One of our entire community's biggest philanthropic initiatives is NYU Dance Marathon (NYDM), which is a year-long effort to raise awareness and funds to help fight childhood cancer. We collaborate with the B+ foundation, and as a community we raised \$403,132.91 last year.

Time Commitment varies by the Chapter. The one consistent thing is that the first semester as a new member is the biggest time commitment. This new membership experience will provide your daughter with the opportunity to develop her leadership, learn about the history of her new organization, develop strong friendships within her new member class, her chapter, and in the great Panhellenic community. We also strongly encourage our members to engage in clubs outside of Fraternity and Sorority Life.

It is important to note that being in a sorority does require some financial planning. A recruitment guidebook will be released to all Potential New Members in September with the average dues breakdown for every chapter. Keep in mind that dues vary from chapter to chapter at NYU. Members' dues directly support the betterment of the chapter and the national organization. Besides the membership fees, there are additional sorority related activities that add to the cost. It is also important to note that chapters may offer various scholarships, grants, and payment plans.
